What is the overall deductible?	For In Network providers \$500 for an individual plan / \$1000 for a family plan. Generally, you must pay all of the costs from providers up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible?	Yes. Doesn't apply to preventive services, services with a fixed dollar copay, prescription drugs and diagnostic testing.
