## Be A Part of the Solution to Ending Rhode Island's Overdose Crisis

The national opioid overdose epidemic is the single greatest public health crisis of our time. In the past five years, we have lost more than 1,400 Rhode Islanders to opioid-related overdose. Governor Gina M. Raimondo established the <u>Overdose Prevention and Intervention Task Force</u> in 2015 to reduce the number of overdose deaths and to save lives.

As a part of this statewide initiative, the <u>Rhode Island Department of Health (RIDOH) Drug Overdose</u>

<u>Prevention Program</u> is partnering with local businesses and corporations to conduct workplace outreach and education for employees. These employee opportunities include:

- Workshops on overdose prevention and the risks of taking opioid prescription pain medications;
- Information on Rhode Island-based treatment and recovery resources;
- Naloxone administration training and overdose response; and
- Recovery-friendly workplace initiatives to support employees who are in recovery
